

Discover the meeting of two pristine rivers; the Elan and Wye. Experience our peaceful Mid Wales countryside. Journey along quiet country lanes,a short section of farm track, over a wibbly-wobbly bridge and back along an old railway. Using minor roads and bridleways, this route includes sections of the Wye Valley Walk and Sustrans Cycle Routes 8 and 81.

Start from Mid Wales Holiday Lets, head over the bridge into Cwmdauddwr and take a left at the phone box.



Mid Wales Holiday Lets

You'll pass the Groe Park and rise up the minor road passing turns for Ddole Farm and Glan Wye until you meet a fork. Take the left (following the road).



As you descend down the road, the river Wye will appear on your left. You'll pass through the walls of what would have been above, a section of Cambrian Railway bridge. Arriving at the Glyn farm, continue towards the stone barn and left through the field gate. Continue along the track until you reach a ford (point 4)



A couple of minutes down the farm track, you'll find a ford in the river Elan. In summer you could challenge yourself to cycle across. To stay dry, take a right and you'll find a suspension bridge.



Cross the bridge, turn right and make your way along the path. You'll see the river Elan flow into the Wye. Locally, the meeting of the rivers is called Junction Pool. Continue along the path through a metal pedestrian gate and turn right onto the minor road. Continue along the road noting the countryside and river Elan again on your right.

At the road junction, bear right and continue along the road. Soon you'll cross a road bridge over the Elan and reach the road junction with the B4518. Take a right along the Elan Valley Trail (once a railway used to build the Elan dams). The traffic-free trail will lead you back to Cwmdauddwr, then make your way back to Mid Wales Holiday Lets.
